

The Classroom Connection[™] Model

A Classroom Connection Community includes one or more schools, churches, or worship/faith centers. While Classroom Connection is designed as a school management utility, it is understood that many private schools work in union with their church, synagogue, mosque, or other worship center. Every attempt is being made to ensure that the needs of all institutions in the community are met.

Each institution in your community works independently of one another in most visible capacities. They are administered separately and can have their own look-and-feel. Administrators can assign a single person to administer one or more of the sites in the community if they so choose.

Each institution includes one or more *site administrators*. This person, often a school administrator or administrative assistant, has access to all functionality of the service. This person has responsibility for coordinating the site's "look and feel." Each site has almost complete control over the visual interface of their web presence.

Each institution also designates one or more *school administrators*. These individuals have access to all school administrative functionality (lunch program, attendance, fee accounts, etc). Note that some of these administrative tasks can be assigned to non-administrative personnel. For instance, non-administrators are often give lunch program admin duties.

Staff members have the ability to manage the look-and-feel of their own virtual office or classroom. As well, their permissions extend to all relevant site functionality. For instance, teachers have access to enough of the lunch program utility to view menus and take daily lunch counts (staff and adult meals).

Visitors to the site have access to much of its functionality without logging in. Upon logging in, the system recognizes the user and assigns the appropriate permissions. This allows the user the opportunity to access only the utilities designed for their use.
